

**TEXAS CLAIM FORM**  
**EXPLORER CLASS ACTION SETTLEMENT**

This Claim Form is to be used to request a discount certificate in the class action settlement in *Ford Explorer Cases*, J.C.C.P. Nos. 4266 & 4270, in the Superior Court for the State of California, Sacramento County. Each certificate is worth \$500 toward the purchase or lease of a new Ford Explorer or \$300 toward the purchase or lease of any other new Ford, Lincoln, or Mercury vehicle. The certificate is valid for 12 months from the date it is issued. The certificate can be used in conjunction with other Ford offers and incentives, but only one certificate can be used at a time. You should read the Notice and Claim Form completely and carefully. If you have any questions, please call 1-866-833-7918 or visit [www.ExplorerClaims.com](http://www.ExplorerClaims.com).

You may be eligible for a certificate if you live in Texas and you owned or leased a 1991-2001 model year Explorer in Texas on August 9, 2000, and you are a resident of Texas as of December 5, 2007. The Class does not include public entities, including cities, counties, and other governmental bodies; anyone who has settled with and released Ford from individual claims substantially similar to those alleged in the related cases; Ford, its subsidiaries and affiliates, officers and directors; and any judge assigned to this case or any of the related cases and their immediate family. Individuals who previously submitted exclusion requests in California and Illinois are not included in the Class.

If you have questions about your eligibility, you should review the class definition in Questions 5-10 of the Notice to determine whether you are a Class member. The Notice is available at [www.ExplorerClaims.com](http://www.ExplorerClaims.com).

Please print (or type) clearly in blue or black ink. If you meet the settlement's eligibility requirements and wish to make a claim for a discount certificate, you must complete this Claim Form and attach copies of the required supporting documentation as explained below. This Claim Form and any required documentation must be postmarked no later than **April 29, 2008**.

#### 4. REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION FOR TEXAS RESIDENTS.

You must provide the following supporting documentation that shows that you are eligible to receive a certificate:

Proof of Ownership or Lease on August 9, 2000. You must provide to the Settlement Administrator documentary evidence that you still owned or were leasing your 1991-2001 model year Explorer on August 9, 2000. Such documentary evidence of ownership on August 9, 2000, may be (a) copies of vehicle registrations or vehicle leasing statements with dates spanning the date August 9, 2000; (b) a certified statement from the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles certifying that you owned or were leasing a 1991-2001 model year Explorer on August 9, 2000; or (c) a copy of a vehicle registration, vehicle leasing statement, vehicle bill of sale, or vehicle title transfer naming you as the transferee, dated before August 9, 2000, and a copy of a vehicle bill of sale or vehicle title transfer naming you as the transferor, dated after August 9, 2000.

Proof of Texas Residency on August 9, 2000. You must provide to the Settlement Administrator documentary evidence that you were a resident of Texas on August 9, 2000. Such documentary evidence of residency may include copies of (a) driver's licenses; (b) property tax notices; (c) homeowner's or renter's insurance certificates; (d) vehicle registrations; or (e) bank statements, spanning the date August 9, 2000.

Proof of Texas Residency on December 5, 2007. You must provide to the Settlement Administrator documentary evidence that you were a resident of Texas on December 5, 2007. Such documentary evidence of residency may include copies of (a) driver's licenses; (b) property tax notices; (c) homeowner's or renter's insurance certificates; (d) vehicle registrations; or (e) bank statements, spanning the date December 5, 2007.

#### 5. TRANSFER CERTIFICATE.

You may elect to have your certificate issued to someone else ("transferee") who lives in your state, subject to the following limitations. You cannot receive any payment or other compensation from any person for requesting that a certificate be issued to anyone other than yourself. ***You must also provide documentary proof that the transferee is a resident of your state. Such documentary evidence of residency may include copies of (a) driver's licenses; (b) property tax notices; (c) homeowner's or renter's insurance certificates; (d) vehicle registrations; or (e) bank statements.***

After a certificate has been issued, it may be transferred once to someone else who is within your immediate family (i.e., your spouse, sibling, child, or domestic partner). A reissued certificate is valid only for the unexpired portion of the 12-month period left over from the original certificate at the time of the transfer. In Texas, domestic partnership is a legal civil union of two persons of the same sex, other than marriage. ***If you want a certificate reissued to another person you must mail the original certificate to the Settlement Administrator, by first-class United States Mail, along with a written request for transfer, together with documentary proof that the transferee is a member of your immediate family and a statement, under penalty of perjury, that the transferee is a member of your immediate family. In the letter please specify the nature of the relationship (i.e., spouse, sibling, child, or domestic partner).***

**8. TIMING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES.**

Review of claims for validity will start when the settlement is finally approved by the Court and the time for submission of claims has ended. The Court in charge of this case still has to decide whether to approve the settlement. Certificates will be issued only if the Court approves the settlement and after the time for appeals has ended and any appeals are resolved and all cases have been dismissed. The hearing on final approval by the Court is scheduled for April 15, 2008. No certificate will be issued for any claim that is determined to be invalid. If your claim is determined to be invalid and is denied, you will be informed by mail.

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
